





### A Profile

**S**hri Manoj Sinha assumed office as the second Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir in August, 2020. Equipped with strong political and administrative acumen, Shri Sinha has worked consistently towards implementing administrative and developmental reforms.

Shri Sinha has immense political experience and his career spans numerous important portfolios. Vice-Chancellor

### A Profile

**P**rof. Nilofer Khan assumed charge as the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Kashmir in May, 2022 and has the distinction of being the first woman Vice-Chancellor of the university. Her appointment was hailed as a welcome step keeping in view the importance of having women's representation in institutes of higher learning. Since assuming office, Prof. Khan has worked fervently towards effective governance, student welfare and maintaining high academic standards. Under her able and dynamic leadership, the University is also making significant progress in gender equality and inclusivity.

A distinguished academician, Prof. Khan has a teaching experience of more than 37 years. In her long career as a teacher, she has supervised more than 25 Ph D scholars and 9 M Phil scholars. She held the position of Director, Institute of Home Sciences at the University of Kashmir for several years and was instrumental in introducing new courses in the curriculum which include M. Sc. in Dietetics and Clinical Nutrition and M. Sc. in Human Development. Prof. Khan has authored five books which have won both national and international acclaim. She has published extensively and has more than seventy publications in reputed national and international journals.

Prof. Khan has also served the corporate life of the University of Kashmir in several important academic and administrative capacities, including Dean, College Development Council, Registrar and Dean, Faculty of Applied Sciences and Technology. She also holds the distinction of being the first woman Dean, Students Welfare of the University and Founder Director, Centre for Women's Studies and Research. Prof. Khan has been a member of various important governing bodies of the University, including the University Council, University Syndicate, Academic Council and Finance Committee. She has also been chairperson of Students' Grievance Committee (University of Kashmir) and Chairperson Internal Complaints Committee (University of Kashmir).

During her illustrious career, Prof. Khan has visited many countries and has gained considerable exposure in the fields of academics and administration. In 2003, she visited several universities in the USA to study the academic and examination system under an international visitors' programme. She has also visited a number of universities and colleges in Australia, Malaysia, Sudan and UAE.







# University of Kashmir: An Overview

**T**he University of Jammu and Kashmir was founded in 1948 as the first University of the State of Jammu and Kashmir. It served as a single affiliating and teaching university for the entire region, catering to both the Jammu and Kashmir divisions. The institution laid the foundation for modern Higher Education in the state by introducing structured undergraduate and postgraduate programmes and promoting research and academic development. In 1969, the University was reorganized under the Kashmir and Jammu Universities Act, leading to the establishment of two separate institutions: the University of Kashmir at Srinagar and University of Jammu.

As the oldest and most reputed University of the region the University of Kashmir has a rich history of academic excellence and infrastructural advancement. Located in the picturesque setting of Hazratbal, Srinagar, the campus spans 247 acres, surrounded by the Zabarwan mountain range and the Dal Lake. This scenic environment complements the university's commitment to academic distinction.

Recognized among the top 50 universities in the country, the University of Kashmir holds a prestigious A++ grade from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and is ranked 8<sup>th</sup> in SPUs, 34<sup>th</sup> in the University category and 59<sup>th</sup> in overall category in the latest National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) of 2025.

The University has shifted to a School system instead of a Faculty system, with 14 Schools and 16 Research Centres in place to facilitate cross disciplinary learning. The university offers a wide range of programs, including 50 PhD, 89 postgraduate, 16 undergraduate courses and 49 Diploma and Certificate courses. Currently, there are 209 Colleges affiliated to the University of Kashmir. The University has been at the forefront of implementing the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 both at the Undergraduate as well as Postgraduate Levels.


The University of Kashmir has the distinction of being a multi-campus Higher Education institution. Over the years the University of Kashmir has expanded substantially and has established Satellite Campuses at Anantnag (South Campus), Baramulla (North Campus), Srinagar (Zakura Campus), Kupwara (Kupwara Campus) and a Sub-Office at Jammu with an objective to make Higher education more accessible in remote areas of Kashmir.

By ensuring a regional presence, the university has spread its reach to remote areas of J&K. This has not only resulted in the advancement of Higher education in these regions but has also promoted social and economic productivity. As an apex institute of higher learning in the geographically and climatically distinctive Himalayan region, the university is of special interest to researchers in the areas of Geology, Ecology, Biodiversity, Anthropology, Glaciology, Art, culture, history and heritage. The University is committed to addressing global, local, and regional developmental needs through its curriculum, which is meticulously designed to align with global standards while fostering intellectual exchanges among teachers, students, and researchers.


The university has an independent and structured e-governance system for student admissions, evaluation and examination, teaching and research, staff recruitment and promotion, student welfare and progression, curriculum planning and development, financial and administrative management.

Research and innovation are integral to the University's mission. The Centre for Interdisciplinary Research and Innovations (CIRI) drives cutting-edge research, collaborating with international institutions like Purdue University, USA, and MD Anderson Cancer Centre. The university has also gained recognition for its climate change research and its faculty's inclusion in Stanford University's top 2% of scientists worldwide. The University prioritizes technology in education, offering Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) and a 24/7 SWAYAM Prabha channel, enhancing its teaching methods. Entrepreneurship is encouraged through the Centre for Innovation, Incubation, and Entrepreneurship (CIIE), which has already secured several patents. With more than 60% female representation in postgraduate programs, the University of Kashmir is a leader in gender equity. Its participation in the Gender Advancement for Transforming Institutions (GATI) project and receipt of the GATI Achievers award highlight its commitment to promoting women in STEM fields. Under the leadership of its first female Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Nilofer Khan, the University continues to advance in academics, research, and administration, ensuring that it remains a significant force in higher education both nationally and globally.

## MULTI-CAMPUS REGIONAL PRESENCE

**T**he University of Kashmir has the distinction of being a multi-campus higher education institution with four satellite campuses spread across various regions of Kashmir in addition to the main campus. By ensuring a regional presence, the University has spread its reach to remote areas of J&K. This has not only resulted in the advancement of Higher education in these regions but has also promoted social and economic productivity.

### SOUTH CAMPUS



SOUTH Campus, University of Kashmir, was established in the year 2008 as the first satellite campus of the University at Fatehgarh, Anantnag in a breath-taking landscape,

overlooking beautiful mountain ranges and serene valleys. The aim of establishing the campus was to make Higher education accessible to all especially students from remote areas. Over the years, this campus has become a preferred destination for students belonging to diverse regions of Jammu and Kashmir, for Post Graduate degree programmes in the disciplines of Business Administration, Computer Sciences, Mathematics, English, Education, M.Ed., Nursing and Urdu.

### NORTH CAMPUS

THE North Campus of the University of Kashmir is operational since 2009 at upper Delina, Baramulla. Initially, two programmes – Masters in Computer Applications (MCA) and B. Tech in Computer Science and Engineering were launched which was followed by M.A English. Five years (BBA+MBA) Integrated Masters Programme in Business Administration (IMBA) was launched from June-July 2012. The campus presently focuses on job-oriented professional and non-professional courses with the aim to provide access to people living in these distant areas to Higher education. By opening this campus, the University has paid special attention to the improvement of social and economic conditions and welfare of the people dwelling in these remote areas by enhancing their intellectual, academic and cultural development through education.



## KUPWARA CAMPUS



THE Kupwara campus of the University of Kashmir is situated in the midst of lush green forests at Wayan, a part of Kahmil watershed of the Kupwara district. The campus

made a small beginning with the introduction of two Five-year integrated courses in Energy Studies and Physics. Another integrated course in Arabic has also been introduced recently. The main emphasis is to provide innovative courses with a wide range of job opportunities, marketability and societal relevance. The mission is to provide quality education at the door steps of the people living in remote corners of the valley and outside. The launch of B.Sc. Nursing Programme at the campus has been recently approved by the University Council in its meeting held on December 14, 2025.

## INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY (IoT) ZAKURA, SRINAGAR

INSTITUTE of Technology, Zakura Campus, is a constituent Institute of University of Kashmir. Established in year 2014 with the approval of University Council and the Govt. of J&K, Institute of Technology has achieved prominence among technical institutions of the UT of J&K in a short duration of less than a decade. The institute offers B.Tech. programme in all the major engineering branches viz., Electronics and Communication, Electrical, Mechanical and Civil Engineering, and M.Tech. in Electronics and Communication, Power System and Control (Electrical Engineering) and Design Engineering (Mechanical Engineering). All the courses offered at the Institute are AICTE approved. Established in 2014, the Institute of Technology (IoT) at Zakura is University of Kashmir's prestigious constituent



engineering college.

For students seeking higher studies, IoT offers Master of Technology (M.Tech.) programs in the Electronics & Communication, Electrical and Mechanical Engineering. Admission is made through the Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering (GATE)

examination. In addition, IoT offers several short-term skill-based training programs through the Centre for Innovation, Incubation and Entrepreneurship (CIIE) and an experiential learning initiative through Four Year Undergraduate Program (FYUGP) offered by the Centre for Design Your Degree (CDYD).

### The University Council

The University Council is the body which has the powers to make statutes, regulations and approve financial estimates of the University in consultation with the Syndicate. ## The Academic Council

The Academic Council controls and regulates the standards of teaching, research and examinations in the University and also prescribes syllabi and other courses of study in accordance with the procedures laid down in the regulations. # MAJOR STRENGTHS

**L**isted among top 50 universities in NIRF rankings consistently, the University of Kashmir is a NAAC Accredited A++ University, ranking 8<sup>th</sup> among State Public Universities, 34<sup>th</sup> in University Category and 59<sup>th</sup> in overall category in the National Institutional Ranking Framework of 2025. This prestigious recognition marks a defining milestone in the University's journey toward academic and institutional excellence. It reflects the collective resolve, unwavering dedication, and exceptional contributions of our academic and administrative fraternity.



## Structured academic and governance systems

The University has an independent, well-established e-governance system in place for student admissions, evaluation and examination, teaching and research, staff recruitment and promotion, student welfare and progression, curriculum planning and development, financial and administrative management through paperless e-office (AMS) system.



## Center for Interdisciplinary Research and Innovations

Under the National brain gain mission, Center for Interdisciplinary Research and Innovations (CIRI) has been established to support the return of overseas Indian origin talented Scientists through prestigious Fellowships like DBT/Wellcome Trust India Alliance, Ramanujan and Ramalingaswami fellowships. CIRI has established an advanced instrumentation facility which includes High resolution Mass Spectroscopy, Confocal facility, XRD facility and FACS. The Center is emerging as a competitive research platform for interdisciplinary research and training in the region. CIRI was awarded the Center for Advanced Research (CAR) by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), New Delhi, Government of India. This prestigious recognition comes with an initial funding support of Rs 6 crores to advance Cancer research.



## Cutting Edge Research

Advanced research facilities have been developed and high-end instruments procured through DST-PURSE, DBT-BUILDER, RUSA, SPARC, ICMR-CAR and other funding schemes during the last few years. These facilities have significantly uplifted the research ecosystem and enabled advanced research practices. During 2019-2025, the University has an impressive **7709** publications, **108709** citations and an average h-index of **115**.

Department of Science and Technology (DST), Govt. of India as part of its National Mission for Sustaining the Himalayan Ecosystem (NMSHE) awarded The Centre of Excellence (CoE) for Glacial Studies in the Western Himalaya to the University of Kashmir with a focus on Cryosphere, Hydrology, and Climate change impacts.



## Highly Qualified Faculty

The University's teaching faculty has exceptional credentials, expertise and experience in their respective fields, with more than 95% faculty members being PhDs, besides having a fine blend of young and experienced faculty.



## Focus on Innovation, Incubation and Entrepreneurship

The University has established a Centre for Innovation, Incubation and Entrepreneurship (CIIE) and has a DST sponsored NewGen IED Centre that nurture new ideas, young innovators and novel ventures. The Centre aims to inculcate a spirit of innovation and entrepreneurship among students, encourage and support start-up creation through guidance, mentorship and support. The Centre is equipped with trained faculty and has imparted training and promoted a vibrant entrepreneurial culture on the campus.



## Gender Equity

The University has a dedicated Centre for Women's Studies, an effective Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) and other measures in place to ensure gender equity. In recognition to its gender specific initiatives, the University has been awarded the Gender Advancement for Transforming Institutions (GATI) award in the year 2023.



### NEP-2020 Aligned Programmes

The University is amongst the first few universities in the country to have implemented NEP 2020 both at UG as well as the PG levels.



### Outreach and Extension Activities

The University has a very strong societal connect through community engagement, public lectures, seminars, technical assistance, counselling, health and wellness programs, as well as cultural, environmental, and sustainability initiatives. Through the Directorate of Lifelong Learning and Skill Development, the University has adopted eight villages to advance socio-economic and skill development goals.



### Network of Satellite Campuses

In addition to its picturesque main campus at Hazratbal Srinagar, the University has four satellite campuses from north to south of Kashmir and Kupwara Campus strategically located in the border district near the Line of Actual Control to provide educational opportunities in remote areas. The University has also established a Sub-Office at Jammu to cater to the needs of the candidates enrolled with the University from outside Kashmir.



### Library Resources

Allama Iqbal Library is the first ISO certified, fully automated University Library in India, that uses the Integrated Library Management Software “Virtua” with a diverse collection on a wide range of subjects. The Central Library has seventy-two departmental libraries attached to it through different University departments, centers, institutes, and campuses. It is one of the largest libraries in India housing a vast collection of books, e-books that provides access to various digital resources. The Library holds more than 8 lakh accessioned books, 56,513 back volumes of journals and over 13,000 e-journals accessible through Govt. of India’s “One Nation One Subscription” initiative.



### State-of-the-Art Infrastructure

Advanced infrastructural facilities like well-equipped laboratories, technology-enabled classrooms, experimental sites and field stations, etc. are reflective of the conducive environment for effective teaching and cutting-edge research.

University’s curriculum is designed to be industry-ready, ensuring that students acquire the practical skills and knowledge required by today’s dynamic job market. Our programs are developed in close collaboration with experts and industry leaders.

### Directorate of Internal Quality Assurance (DIQA)

Assurance (DIQA) ensures quality in the entire workflow system besides academics, research and faculty development.

# MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

The University of Kashmir has earned a remarkable status in the higher education and research landscape of the country, and is making significant progress in its mission of achieving academic excellence. Following is a brief list of some of its major achievements in academics and research in the recent past.



## Research Collaborations and MoUs

The University of Kashmir fosters a collaborative spirit in research and pursues a policy of global and national engagement via strategic partnerships. The University has undertaken both national and international collaborative projects with eminent institutions like IC-IMPACTS Centre of Excellence (Vancouver, Canada), Purdue University (USA), Harvard University, MD Anderson Cancer Centre, (USA), The Indian Institute of Science Education and Research, (Pune), National Centre for Biological Sciences, (Bengaluru), National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI), Hyderabad. Consortium MOU with IIFM, Tezpur University, Mononmaniam Sundaranar University and Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University. Other collaborations/MoUs include IIS Gujarat, IIT Mumbai, IUCAA, Pune, IIT Roorkee, IIT Hyderabad and EDII, Ahmedabad.



## Nodal Agency for NITI Aayog's Atal Innovation Mission (AIM)

In a significant development, University of Kashmir became the first to be appointed as a nodal agency by NITI Aayog, Government of India, for the implementation of the prestigious ATL Sarthi programme. As a flagship initiative of the Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), ATL Sarthi aims to provide essential guidance and support to facilitate the growth and success of Atal Tinkering Labs (ATLs) across India. The University has been designated as the Nodal agency for 127 Atal Tinkering Labs (ATLs) across J&K and will play a pivotal role in this effort, overseeing the programme in Jammu and Kashmir and nearby regions, including Himachal Pradesh and Ladakh.



## ICMR-Center for Advanced Research

Center for Interdisciplinary Research and Innovations (CIRI) has been awarded the prestigious Center for Advanced Research (CAR) by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), New Delhi, Government of India. This prestigious recognition comes with an initial funding support of Rs 6 crores to advance Cancer research and development of new therapeutic strategies.



## Expanding Scholarly Footprint through Journals

The University of Kashmir publishes a diverse range of peer-reviewed and refereed academic journals across various disciplines reflecting its strong research culture in Sciences, Humanities, and the Social sciences. A total of 25 journals are published by the University which are brought out by various departments and research centers. All journals disseminate original research and maintain rigorous editorial and publication practices. The journals further strengthen the University's research visibility and intellectual footprint. Many of these journals are now available in Open Access formats on their respective departmental sub-domains.



## Advanced Research Grant from ANRF

The University of Kashmir has achieved a major milestone in strengthening its research and innovation ecosystem by securing a research grant worth Rs. 8.5 crore under the Advanced Research Grant (ARG) Scheme of the Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF), Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India.



## Awards and Recognitions

Prof. Shafi Shauq, former faculty at the Department of Kashmiri, was named among the recipients of the Padma Shri Award 2026. The prestigious award is a recognition of Prof. Shauq's remarkable contribution in preserving, enriching and promoting Kashmiri language and literature and is a matter of collective pride for the University. Notably, seven alumni of the University have been honored with the Padma Shri prior to this. This prestigious award reflects the University's commitment to rigorous standards in scholarly pursuits. Previously, Prof. Rahman Rahi, Kashmir's greatest modern poet and former faculty at the Department of Kashmiri, University of Kashmir had received the highest literary award in the country, the Jnanpith Award in 2007, for his exceptional contribution to Kashmiri literature and poetry.



## Center for Advanced Instrumentation for Research

The University has established a Centre for Advanced Instrumentation for Research with advanced research facilities. The center houses high-end research facilities like High-resolution Mass spectrometer, Confocal Microscope, Thunder Imager, Fluorescence-Activated Cell Sorting (FACS), X-ray Diffraction (XRD). The Centre is emerging as a rich platform for interdisciplinary research, training, skill development and handholding other institutions in the region.



### **DST-PURSE Research Grant**

The University of Kashmir is the recipient of prestigious DST-PURSE grant of Rs.10.00 crores under the prestigious Promotion of University Research and Scientific Excellence (PURSE) programme of the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India.



### **DST-FIST Research Grant**

The Department of Physics, University of Kashmir, has been awarded a prestigious research grant under the FIST (Fund for Improvement of S&T Infrastructure) Program by the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India. This grant, recommended under Level B category, will provide significant financial support to augment research facilities in the department over the next five years.



### **Major Interdisciplinary Funding**

The Centre for Interdisciplinary Research and Innovations (CIRI) has received Rs. 10 crore DBT-BUILDER grant for promotion of interdisciplinary research and education. Dr. Altaf Bhat, faculty at this Centre has been awarded around Rs 1.5 crore research grant by the Lady Tata Memorial Trust to study the genomic underpinnings of Leukemia.



### **Patents in Emerging Technologies**

A team of student innovators and faculty members from the Department of Electronics and Instrumentation Technology, University of Kashmir (KU), has been granted a patent by the Patent Authority of India for their ground-breaking 'Portable Microcontroller-based Impedance Meter for Biological Tissue Analysis' device and 'Semicircular Brain Tumour Detection Antenna' & 'Twist Ease Clean (TEC) tank' designs. This innovative solution is set to revolutionize the fields of Biomolecular tissue analysis for cancer detection and food adulteration, traditional water tank cleaning methods, addressing persistent safety and efficiency issues. A team of innovators from the Centre for Innovation, Incubation, and Entrepreneurship (CIIE), Institute of Technology (IoT), Zakura Campus has secured a patent for its ground-breaking technology titled, 'A Smart Room Heater Configured to Operate on Low Voltage under Blanket Usage'.



### **Prestigious National/International Fellowship/Awards**

Research scholar from the Department of Botany, Showkat Ahmad Gojery, has secured a prestigious fellowship to work at ETH Zurich, Switzerland. Ms. Partavi Haq, a student of the Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences has been awarded the prestigious Prof. M. L. Khorana Gold Medal by the Indian Pharmaceutical Association. Umer Majeed Khaja, a researcher from the Department of Clinical Biochemistry, has been awarded the prestigious Global Scholar-in-Training Award (GSITA) 2025 by the American Association for Cancer Research (AACR). Arjamand Mushtaq, a research scholar from the Centre for Interdisciplinary and Innovations (CIRI), has been awarded the prestigious Chandrasekhar Memorial Award, 2024 for her contributions to Biomedical Sciences.



### **Himalayan Ice-Core Laboratory**

National Himalayan Ice-Core Laboratory: The Department of Geology has been granted a financial assistance of around INR crores for the establishment of this lab by the Department of Science & Technology.



### **Part of Ministry of Education SPARC Scheme**

Owing to its impressive NIRF ranking, University of Kashmir has joined the prestigious league of universities to participate in Scheme for Promotion of Academic and Collaborative Research (SPARC)- an initiative launched by the Ministry of Education. Many ongoing Indo-US projects are sponsored under the scheme.



### **Student Academic Achievements**

Students from the University of Kashmir have shown significant progress in academics and research. From 2018-25, a total of 2596 students qualified various competitive examinations like NET/SET/GATE etc. In 2023-25, a total of 745 students were enrolled for Ph D programmes and 509 Ph D Degrees were awarded.

## ACADEMIC REFORMS

**NEP-2020** aligned curricula for UG and PG programmes. Syllabi have been updated keeping in view the thrust on interdisciplinary and skill-based courses. PG Programme launched under NEP has a flexible exit option for students. The University offers a diverse range of courses across disciplines, including traditional, skill-based, entrepreneurial, and digital technology programs. The University emphasizes employability, skill development and entrepreneurship by integrating industry-relevant courses into its curriculum. Curriculum is aligned with the Learning Outcome-Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) and focuses on clearly defined Program Outcomes (POs), Course Outcomes (COs), and Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs)

The University became one of the only few institutions in the country to be completely compliant with the **NAD** and a Directorate of NAD and Data Analysis was established for this purpose.

A practice of sharing **student feedback of teachers** through their respective Deans is followed every year.

**Unit/Credit** based continuous assessment has replaced traditional examinations to reduce time loss in conducting exams and ensure continuous monitoring of student performance.



**Academic calendar** has been streamlined and a uniform academic calendar notified by the UT Govt. is being followed in letter and spirit.



**Student acceptance** for answer book evaluation has been mandated to make evaluation process completely transparent and grievance-free.



**Live marks** visualization system has been introduced to enable students to see their marks as soon as they are uploaded by evaluators.



**Single- Window System** for prompt redressal of concerns of students



**Credit transfer policy** was adopted so that students complete their requisite credits from the department/institution of their choice under the Choice Based Credit System.



**Degree certificates** dispatched and uploaded on digilocker within one month of the declaration of result



For **timely completion** of all degrees, advance examination dates-sheets are notified at the beginning of each semester in order to ensure that all the stakeholders remain aware of the timelines.

## ADMINISTRATIVE REFORMS



**Administrative Management System (AMS)**, an in-house e-governance ERP developed and implemented by the Directorate of IT&SS has replaced paper files with a unified digital platform. This includes e-filing and e-communication system, Employee Services (Forms and NOC), Circulars and Bulk SMS Email, Finance and Budget, Projects and Compliance, Analytics and Reports.



**Budget Assessments and Approvals Committee (BAAC)** has been constituted including members from outside the University to assess and approve annual budgets for different departments purely on the basis of zero-deficit based budgeting principle.



**Online application system** has been put in place for all the positions enabling hassle-free fee payment and status tracking.



**Online calculation** of academic scores and automated shortlisting has made recruitment transparent and efficient.



**Well-defined and duly approved policies** such as Hostel Accommodation Policy, I.T Policy, Promotion and Transfer Policy, Recruitment Policy, Purchase Policy, Financial Reforms Policy, Research Policy including policy for incentivizing research grant submission, Policy for specially-abled students, Anti-Plagiarism Policy etc. have been put in place. In addition, few more new policies have been framed recently like Policy for Dual, Twinning and Foreign degrees, policy for creditization of Sports and Cultural activities etc.



**Dashboard for Recruitment Section** generates shortlisted candidates automatically with eligibility check by the e-Recruitment system, besides auto generation of call letters through email and SMS using e-Recruitment system.



**Digital initiatives** in the University's Financial Administration include an integrated salary engine, budgeting module, a comprehensive Budget & Financial Management System in handling proposals, releases, bills, advances, and QR-based inventory tracking.



# NAAC Accreditation 2025: A Milestone

In a historic milestone, the University of Kashmir was awarded Grade A++ with a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 3.68, by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), in its 4th accreditation cycle in May, 2025. This is the highest grade in the University's history, placing it among the top universities in India under the revised NAAC assessment framework.

The three-day NAAC peer team visit was conducted from 29<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> May, 2025 in a hybrid format with two members on-site and five members participating virtually via live streaming. On the first day of the visit, the Vice-Chancellor Prof. Nilofer Khan made a detailed presentation documenting the University's profile over the last 5 years. This was followed by detailed documentation review including the University's Self-study Report (SSR) as well as interactions with key administrative persons. During the visit, the team inspected academic departments, research centers and labs, governance, infrastructure and student services and IT facilities across the Main and satellite campuses.

On the concluding day of the visit, the NAAC peer team held a formal exit meeting with faculty, administrative officials, non-teaching staff at the Convocation complex of the University. During the exit meeting, the Peer Team lauded several areas of the University's growth like infrastructure upgradation, research output and publications, academic collaborations, IT and digital governance, examination reforms, community engagement and extension education, Student support services and innovation, incubation and skill-development initiatives.



Specific mention was made of the following:

- **Research & Innovation:** Growth in research output and publications.
- **Infrastructure:** Extensive use of ICT tools, 232 smart classrooms, and a fully automated Allama Iqbal Library.
- **Digital Initiatives:** Successful integration of DigiLocker and robust in-house e-governance systems.
- **Student Support:** A 78% satisfaction rate in the Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) and a "single-window" system for examination services.
- **Societal Impact:** Recognition of community engagement through initiatives like the USHA Silai Schools and urban resilience campaigns.




# National Recognition: Awards Conferred



The University of Kashmir is the first Higher Education Institution in Kashmir to implement the New Education Policy NEP (2020) recommendations in all its affiliated colleges since August 2022. This landmark step, aimed at systemic educational reforms was undertaken to encourage inclusion, critical thinking, flexibility of choice, skill-based and experiential learning as spelt out in the policy. This step will go a long way in not only ensuring educational reforms but significantly altering the educational landscape of the region. The University has framed innovative, skill-based, and multidisciplinary curricula for both major and minor courses, shifting from traditional rote-based education to dynamic, student-centric, and result-oriented syllabi. In August 2025, the University implemented NEP-2020 recommendations at the postgraduate level and admitted its first batch of students for their two-year Master's Degree Programme. Initiatives taken include curricular flexibility, multidisciplinary, experiential learning, respect for diversity and local context, extensive use of technology, creativity and critical thinking.


In May, 2024, yet another innovative step was the launch of the four-year undergraduate DYD (Design Your Degree) program. This student-centric framework allows students to shape their academic

journey and pursue their own interests with freedom and flexibility. It empowers students to curate their degrees, fostering self-confidence, critical thinking and breaking down barriers between disciplines.

## Key Features of NEP (2020) Implementation at the University of Kashmir: Course Curriculum and Admissions

- Established a NEP Cell in compliance with UGC guidelines in March, 2022 to work for its implementation.
- The course curriculum and framework was redesigned as per NEP 2020 and adopted/notified for implementation at UG level in all affiliated colleges of our University from the academic session, 2022.
- The NEP based UG programme has been fully implemented and the students admitted in 2022 shall complete their 4-year graduation with honours/research in 2026.
- The admission to 2-year PG programmes i.e., first batch as per NEP 2020 was done in the year 2025 and presently its classwork





is underway at the University and in some affiliated colleges. Accordingly, admission to one-year PG course as per NEP 2020 will commence in summer, 2026.

- The University has redesigned its PG course curriculum as per NEP based guidelines for PG programme issued by UGC in June, 2024. The statutes have also been notified vide university notification No F( PG-Statutes NEP-2020) Aad/KU/2025 dated 14-02-2025, available on the University website.
- The University has already redesigned its course curriculum of FYIMP 5-year Integrated Master's degree programs that are being offered in several departments both in our main and some satellite campuses. The statutes are also notified vide university notification under No. F(Statutes- Integrated programmes)Acad/ KU/2024 dated 25-07-2024, available on the University website.
- The admission to FYIMP 5-year Integrated Master's degree programmes in 2024 was made as per NEP-2020 policy / recent guidelines issued by the UGC.

- University has nominated NEP Coordinators from each department, Institute, Research Centre and affiliated colleges for effective communication and implementation of NEP-2020.
- The NEP policy advocates flexibility in curricular design, allowing tailoring of programs according to the needs and interests of students. 'Design Your Degree' programme was launched as a landmark concept in this direction. The first batch was admitted in 2024 and second batch in 2025 with good response in terms of enrolment.
- The University developed guidelines for incorporating Programme Learning Outcomes (PLOs), Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs) and a common template for mapping their attainment levels. The course curriculum was reoriented across all departments as per these outcomes as per NEP (2020). Several workshops were organized by the NEP Cell of the University to train its faculty about framing these learning outcomes, calculating their attainment levels and mapping them with each other for identifying any gaps.

and cater to diverse learning styles, emphasizing that every student is actively and meaningfully engaged in their educational journey. A number of measures have been undertaken to address differences in learning levels of slow and fast learners.

Besides regular interaction between faculty and learners, classroom teaching is augmented by providing accessible reading material and special one-on-one sessions for slow learners. ICT facilities are used to communicate concepts through latest digital technologies and audio-visual tools while language departments also assist in honing the speaking and writing skills of such students. University's Educational Multimedia Research Centre (EMRC) has been at the forefront of the digitization of education and is constantly upgrading its online resources making use of latest gadgetry and expertise. The University also caters to the needs of its learners by providing opportunities for their career planning, counselling and placement. Our Centre for Career-Counselling, Coaching and Placement (CCCP) regularly organizes orientation, counselling, career guidance, motivational training and coaching programmes to prepare them for the global job markets as well as for various national level competitive examinations like IAS, JKAS, NET, SET, JRF, NEET, JEE etc.

# Examination and Evaluation

The University has an efficient Examination Wing working under the direct supervision of the Controller of Examinations, which oversees the conduct of examinations at the main campus, various satellite campuses as well as affiliated colleges throughout the Kashmir valley. These include examinations for various undergraduate, postgraduate and professional courses. The examination system is governed by well-documented guidelines and statutes pertaining to the conduct, evaluation, and post-evaluation processes. IT integration and various other reforms in the examination procedures and processes (including continuous internal assessment and end-semester assessment) have brought a considerable improvement in the examination management system of the institution. Student grievances are promptly addressed and resolved in a time bound manner.

In 2023, the University of Kashmir introduced single-window clearance, digital exams, e-Awards, and IVR support, cutting delays, boosting transparency, and creating a faster, student-centric academic ecosystem.

The University has introduced a single window admission process with the policy of “One Student-One Form”, which includes Semester Examination Form, Single Programme Enrolment Number and a Single Transcript with chip-enabled degree certificate. A student-friendly mobile App allows students to manage most of their examination related affairs. The University has registered itself on the NAD-Digilocker Platform with the Controller of Examination of the university managing the NAD Cell. The award data/marks of all the students who were admitted from 2022 onwards are being uploaded on the NAD-Digilocker Platform.

Examination Wing of the University of Kashmir introduced a “Single Window Clearance System (SWCS)” in May 2024 to streamline student services, allowing students to resolve all examination-related queries and tasks (like form submissions, fee payments, result verifications) at one central point, eliminating the need to visit multiple offices, making processes quicker and more efficient with digital support. This student-centric initiative aims to improve service delivery, ensure timely results, and enhance the overall examination experience by bringing technology and central coordination to the forefront.

University has also registered itself for the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) for facilitating multiple-entry-multiple exit and credit-transfer between institutions in accordance with the provisions of National Education Policy-2020. University of Kashmir was among the first few institutions of the country to implement NEP-2020 at the UG level soon after its notification by the Govt. of India in June, 2020. A NEP cell has been constituted to overlook the implementation of NEP-2020 in a time-bound manner that has resulted in successful completion of two semesters. In order to create awareness about various provisions and implementation of these initiatives, numerous workshops and seminars have been conducted by the University.

The university is deeply committed to evaluating its students' learning levels. To identify variations in understanding and proficiency, the varsity conducts assessments at regular intervals. Following these evaluations, special programs such as remedial classes, enrichment courses, and personalized tutoring sessions are organized to ensure that no student falls behind due to difficulty in grasping the course content.

The University is dedicated to promote an empathetic and supportive academic environment, achieved through comprehensive Mentor-Mentee Schemes, student-driven learning methods, and targeted programs designed to meet the diverse learning needs of its students.

The University has also introduced online Examination Management System (EMS) to automate and streamline the billing process, which was earlier very labour-intensive and prone to errors. The newly introduced EMS has significantly improved the efficiency and transparency of accounts management. Further, to streamline the verification process of pass-out students from various agencies/departments, online verification software has been introduced. This system automates the verification process and is accessible to any department or agency across the globe, thereby ensuring timely and authentic verification of academic credentials.

# Curricular Design and Development

**U**niversity of Kashmir is sensitive to the importance of curriculum design, development and implementation. Departments regularly update their courses, review and revise syllabi keeping in mind the current advances in various fields as well as needs of the global job markets. The University, guided by its vision and mission promotes diversified thinking in the process of curriculum design and development with an aim to accommodate local, national and global needs. The University also takes all necessary measures to consolidate the strengths of different curricula in order to make them interdisciplinary, result-oriented and competitive in nature.

The UG and PG Boards of Studies have revised and aligned curricula of all the programmes/courses offered at PG and UG levels as per the Learning Outcome-Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) of the UGC. The focus has been to bridge the gap between job-markets and the job-seekers and at the same time equip job-seekers with the required professional and personal skills. This framework has been instrumental in increasing employability of students and more importantly revolutionized the teaching-learning process. Many courses now feature strong industry-academia linkages to provide hands-on training to learners for the upgradation of their skills and competencies.

The University's Centre for Career-Counselling, Coaching and Placement (CCCP) provides students with an opportunity to actualize their full potential by providing them career planning and development guidance through counselling, coaching and training programmes for developing their decision-making skills, reinforcement of appropriate work skills and attitudes, besides preparing them for various national level competitive examinations. It also provides them a platform for training and placements, honing their soft skills and developing linkages with the corporate world. Directorate of Lifelong Learning and Skill Development aims to bring about a change in the lives of common masses of the region by providing a plethora of professional, vocational, skill-based and job-oriented courses, workshops, trainings, seminars, sensitization-cum-awareness programmes etc not

only to the students but to the administrative staff and teaching faculty of the University too.

University of Kashmir is committed to addressing global, local, and regional developmental needs through its curriculum, which is meticulously designed to align with global standards while fostering intellectual exchanges among teachers, students, and researchers. The University offers a diverse range of courses across disciplines, including traditional, skill-based, entrepreneurial, and digital technology programs. It integrates practical skills into its curriculum to promote holistic student development. More than 90% programmes have components of field projects, research projects and internships. Electronic, digital media and other digital components have been incorporated in over 86% courses offered through distance learning mode.

Curriculum updates are rigorously managed by statutory bodies like the Boards of Postgraduate and Undergraduate Studies, which include external experts and student representatives. These boards regularly review the curriculum to ensure alignment with the National Curriculum Framework and competitive examinations like NET, JRF, and Civil Services. The university has implemented the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) across most undergraduate and postgraduate programs, allowing students to choose electives that foster multidisciplinary education.

In line with the National Education Policy (NEP-2020), the university introduced a multidisciplinary curriculum for the four-year undergraduate program (FYUP) in 2022. This curriculum is aligned with the Learning Outcome-Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) and focuses on clearly defined Program Outcomes (POs), Course Outcomes (COs), and Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs). The curriculum is regularly updated to meet the demands of the global job market, ensuring that the students are exposed to contemporary global advancements. In August 2025, our University implemented the NEP (2020) framework for its PG programmes. Accordingly, the University redesigned its PG course curriculum as per NEP based guidelines for PG programme issued by UGC in June, 2024. The University has




# Research, Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development

**T**he University of Kashmir has adopted a robust research promotion policy that promotes cutting-edge, context-sensitive, need-based, translational and multidisciplinary research in accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP-2020). The University ensures that the research conducted by faculty, scholars, and other members is at par with global standards of research and publishing. In furtherance of this objective, emphasis is laid on publication of research findings in high impact journals of national and international repute. Due to these sustained efforts, as many as 14 KU scientists made it to Stanford University's research database of top 2% Scientists in 2025.

The University relies on the h-index, i-10 index, number of citations, cumulative impact factor and other relevant indices to evaluate the research conducted by its faculty members. These criteria are also considered for the grant of best teacher awards by the University.

The research facilities at the University are continuously upgraded to meet global standards. The office of the Dean, Research, is responsible for the successful implementation of the research policy and to maintain quality of research. A Research Council has also been constituted to identify key areas and conduct research in a structured and systematic manner.

The University of Kashmir stands fully committed to its well-documented policy of promotion of quality research and consultancy which is evident from the ever-growing number of extramurally funded research projects, expansion of the network of national and international collaborations, increase in research output and the number of students who have been awarded M. Phil and Ph.D. degrees.

Research in Social Sciences and Humanities has gained momentum in recent years and there has been an increase in the grant of Research projects and fellowships in these disciplines. There is also a marked increase in the number of high-quality publications in Languages and Literary Studies, Linguistics and other allied departments.



Additionally, Entrepreneurship Development Cells and Incubation Centres have been established in various departments like Department of Food Sciences and Technology, and have been granted approval by the Food Safety and Services Authority of India (FSSAI). New Generation Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre (NewGen IEDC) is a programme launched by National Science and Technology Entrepreneurship Development Board (NSTEDB), Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India. At the University of Kashmir, NewGen IEDC aims to inculcate a spirit of innovation and entrepreneurship amongst the young S&T students, encourage and support start-up creation through guidance, mentorship and support.

# e-Governance Initiatives

The Administrative Management System (AMS) is the University of Kashmir's in-house, end-to-end e-Governance ERP being developed and implemented by the Directorate of IT&SS. It is replacing paper files, scattered data, and manual registers with a unified digital platform. Built, deployed, and battle-tested on a campus of 4,000+ employees and 90+ departments, AMS is powering paperless, transparent, and real-time administration for universities and government institutions.

At the University of Kashmir, AMS is making over 95% of administrative workflows paperless, is reducing file movement from weeks to hours, and is bringing complete traceability to budgets, grants, and legal cases. Net outcome is a campus where governance is becoming faster, cleaner, and completely data-driven—on a system built by the university, for the University.



### **Establishment of IT Innovation Park**

An IT Innovation Park has been established and is functioning at the University of Kashmir as a centre for technological excellence, innovation, and research collaboration. It provides an integrated ecosystem for research, incubation, training, and entrepreneurship, supported by modern infrastructure and advanced digital facilities.

The park fosters innovation and incubation for startups, offering mentorship for IT startups, promoting industry-academia collaboration in emerging technologies, strengthening e-governance and digital innovation, creating skill development, employment, and entrepreneurship opportunities, and positioning the University as a regional technology and innovation hub.

A BPO Training Centre has also been established within the park, providing industry-relevant IT and communication skills training to enhance employability among youth across the region.

### **Digital Governance and IT Consultancy Services Offered**

The Directorate of IT&SS offers consultancy services and SaaS-based solutions to various departments of the Government of Jammu and Kashmir. It has developed and is managing critical SaaS applications such as the Vigilance Clearance System (VCS), Property Return System (PRS), Employee Verification System (EVS), Regular Departmental Action Portal (RDA), Central Verification System (CVS), and the J&K Cable Car e-Ticketing Portal for Gondola.

The Directorate has also provided a fully operational Treasury Bill Portal module to the Islamia College of Science and Commerce and has provisioned the Salary and HR modules of AMS for SKUAST Jammu as SaaS, ensuring seamless integration and real-time functionality.

In addition, the Directorate has provided consultancy services to SKUAST Kashmir for setting up its Data Centre and has surveyed, designed specifications, and implemented CCTV surveillance, LAN systems, and firewall infrastructure at the Government Dental College.

These initiatives are strengthening digital governance and operational efficiency across government entities and academic institutions while fostering innovation through virtualization, resource optimization, and interconnectivity, in alignment with the broader vision of digital sustainability and e-governance excellence in the region.

### **State-of-the-Art Green Data Centre**

The Directorate of IT&SS has also established a state-of-the-art Green Data Centre, equipped with high-end computer servers, enterprise-grade firewalls, smart racks, energy-efficient cooling systems, and an automated backup and recovery system. The facility provides a secure, scalable, and resilient infrastructure for hosting critical applications, data storage, and virtualization, supporting the University's digital transformation initiatives and promoting sustainable, high-performance computing across academic and administrative domains.

At the University of Kashmir, an in-house e-Governance ERP (AMS) has made over 95% administrative workflows paperless, cutting file movement from weeks to hours while enabling fully traceable, real-time digital governance.



# Community Outreach and Extension Activities

The University of Kashmir stands as a beacon of community engagement and social awareness and is dedicated to fostering holistic growth among its students and extending its positive influence to the wider society. Through a diverse array of community outreach initiatives, it brings together students, scholars and communities from various backgrounds to celebrate culture, advocate for health, promote social awareness and enhance personal and professional skills. These endeavours showcase the University's unwavering commitment to holistic education and its vital role as a catalyst for positive change in Kashmir Valley and beyond.

The University of Kashmir has been promoting community engagement and extension activities among its students and teachers as well as the non-teaching staff for their holistic and sustained development. Various centres and departments of the University like Directorate of Lifelong Learning and Skill Development (DLL&SD), National Service Scheme (NSS), Dept of Students' Welfare (DSW), Department of Social Work, Law Society of Kashmir, Law School, Department of Sociology, Department of Botany, Institute of Music and Fine Arts, Centre of Research for Development (CORD), Education Media Research Centre (EMRC), University Health Centre and University Landscape Development Division (ULD) actively participate in these activities on a regular basis. Some of the activities undertaken by these departments and centres include adoption of villages in its neighbourhood, extension activities through the NSS wing, Legal aid clinics, screening of documentaries and films, Medical Camps, Adult education programmes through its State Resource Centre and educational trips and extension activities at the University Model School.

Directorate of Lifelong Learning and Skill Development of the University of Kashmir has been established in the year 1978 and since then it has been offering training courses for skill enhancement of students and staff, capacity building programmes for lifelong learning besides various programmes under its community outreach and extension activities. This Directorate has adopted several villages under its "Area-based Community Development (ABCD)" programme and has undertaken diverse community outreach and extension activities in these adopted villages.

The Directorate of Lifelong Learning at the University of Kashmir believes in the premise

# Department of Students' Welfare: Nurturing and Enriching Student Life

The Department of Students' Welfare, University of Kashmir, plays a proactive and dynamic role by implementing a wide spectrum of student-centric initiatives aimed at their holistic development. Through a balanced integration of capacity building, health awareness, cultural engagement, civic responsibility, national integration, and social outreach, the division remained committed to nurturing informed, creative, and socially responsible youth.

A major focus area throughout has been capacity building and national-level exposure of the students on a perpetual and consistent basis. The University participated in a Training-cum-Orientation Programme on Parliamentary Procedures organized by the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, Government of India, at Munnar, Kerala.

In the domain of health awareness and social responsibility, the Students Welfare Division, through its Red Ribbon Club, organized an HIV/AIDS and Drug Addiction Awareness Programme in collaboration with the J&K AIDS Control Society and the Department of Health. The programme included a 5 km Red Run and a 2 km Walkathon, with participation of nearly 250 students. Cultural performances and motivational talks effectively reinforced messages of prevention, compassion, and healthy lifestyles. Additionally, a Social Service Camp was organized on the eve of Holy Prophet's birth anniversary "Eid-e-Milad-un-Nabi" (SAW), reflecting the University's commitment to compassion, service, and communal harmony.

The Division actively promoted civic engagement and national values through the celebration of the 78th Independence Day. Activities included an intra-university poster and painting competition, a 'Nasha Mukta Bharat' pledge-taking ceremony, and a grand cultural programme highlighting patriotism, unity, and diversity. Programmes such as "Voting Towards Progress" and the Youth Convention on World Drug

Students represented the University at the North Zone Inter-University Youth Festival at Punjabi University, Patiala, and later at the AIU National Inter-University Youth Festival at Amity University, Noida, showcasing artistic talent and cultural diversity.

Cultural exchange and national integration were further strengthened through educational and cultural exchange programmes visits to Hyderabad and Delhi, and participation in the Indian Army's Sadbhawna Mission. Major institutional events such as Sonzal 2025, Viksit Bharat 2047 initiatives, and an Art Camp fostered creativity, innovation, and youth engagement in nation-building.

The Division also organized workshops and training programmes for festival contingents, inter-college debates under IAPPD, national-level debate participation, and thematic events such as Shaan-e-Ramadan 2025, celebrating spiritual and cultural heritage.

Through these sustained initiatives, the Department of Students' Welfare reaffirmed its pivotal role in nurturing confident, capable, and socially conscious youth, aligned with the University of Kashmir's vision and national priorities of inclusive and holistic development.

# Student Support and Progression

**U**niversity of Kashmir exhibits a strong dedication to student support and advancement, characterized by a well-rounded framework aimed at enriching both academic and personal growth. Key to this endeavor is the provision of scholarships and free-ships, ensuring that financial limitations do not obstruct students' educational aspirations. The University also equips students with essential skills through comprehensive capacity-building programs focused on soft skills, ICT, and language proficiency, thereby preparing them for both academic and career success. At the heart of the university's support system is the Centre for Career-Counselling, Coaching and Placement (CCCP). The CCCP has greatly influenced student outcomes by providing coaching for competitive exams like IAS, JKAS, NEET, JEE, NET, and JRF, as well as organizing recruitment drives that have successfully placed numerous students in prestigious companies. The Centre's impact is further underscored by its provision of psychometric assessments and individualized career guidance, managed by a team of 66 skilled and trained career counselors.

The University's commitment to student welfare is also reflected in its firm stance against sexual harassment and ragging, supported by effective grievance redressal mechanisms. Moreover, the institution nurtures a dynamic campus environment, encouraging participation in sports, cultural activities, and student governance through the Students' Council. Furthermore the University is taking several measures for expanding employer engagement to enhance placement rates and in aligning its educational offerings with the changing demands of the job markets.

Students from remote areas, in particular, encounter difficulties in accessing the full range of career services. To overcome these challenges, the University has envisaged extending digital counseling services, strengthening collaborations with national and international institutions, and more effectively utilizing its alumni network. The University of Kashmir will further solidify its position as a leading institution in fostering student success by investing in infrastructure and improving the integration of career counselling services with academic programs.

# Inclusion, Accessibility and Sensitivity: A Unified Campus

In keeping with its core value of promoting inclusivity, the University of Kashmir lays great emphasis on providing support and ensuring quality campus facilities for its differently-abled students. The University is keen to create a learner-friendly campus where every student feels supported and empowered. To fulfill this aim, the University has taken several initiatives to strengthen student support services and significantly stepped up its efforts to create a barrier-free campus. These reforms range from high-tech library facilities to physical transport solutions on campus.

## Dedicated Support & Infrastructure

- **Advisory Committee for PwDs:** Established in 2025, this committee oversees the implementation of disability rights and ensures that policy-level interventions are not just symbolic.
- **Special Cell (DSW):** The Special Cell under the Department of Students' Welfare serves as the primary touchpoint for students, coordinating the distribution of assistive aids and appliances.
- **On-Campus Transport:** The University recently introduced a pick-and-drop battery car service specifically for students with special needs to facilitate easy mobility across the campus.

## Allama Iqbal Library (AIL) Facilities

The Central library is a hub for academic accessibility, featuring a dedicated Special Browsing Facility for visually impaired students.

- **Assistive Devices:** The library provides "Angel Pro" talking devices (Daisy players) for reading e-books and dedicated computers with Magic Keyboards.
- **Specialized Software:** Systems are equipped with JAWS (Screen Reading) and Kurzweil 1000 (Text-to-Speech) software to facilitate independent research and writing.
- **Physical Access:** Implementation of lifts, ramps with handrails and accessible restrooms.

## Academic & Financial Reforms

- **Fee Exemptions:** Under University statutes, the Vice-Chancellor can grant exemptions from admission and other fees to permanently disabled candidates on a case-by-case basis.
- **Seat Reservation:** The University maintains a strictly enforced 3% to 5% reservation (depending on the specific course and updated UGC norms) for differently-abled candidates in all UG and PG programs.
- **Special Education Programs:** In 2025, the University signed an MoU with the Voluntary Medicare Society (VMS) to explore launching a Bachelor's Programme in Special Education and conducting skill-based workshops for differently-abled students. The collaboration will also focus on enhancing human resources, improving accessibility infrastructure and extend technical support.



## Equal Opportunity Cell (Special Cell): Roles and Responsibilities

In order to have a centralized and nodal platform for meeting the needs and requirements of its differently-abled students, the University established an Equal Opportunity Cell in 2009 which operates under the Department of Students' Welfare. This Special Cell was set up for the welfare of differently-abled students admitted at the University and comprises of the Dean, Students' Welfare, Coordinator, Special Cell, Counsellor, Special Cell and members drawn from physically challenged students enrolled in different teaching departments and research centers/institutes. This Cell guides the University administration in taking necessary welfare measures to ensure and facilitate smooth and barrier-free education for persons with special needs. This ensures equality, freedom and dignity for persons with disabilities by providing equal opportunities, protection of rights and assuring full participation in society.

Apart from day to day activities, this cell oversees the implementation of reservation policies in admission and employment, provides guidance and counselling regarding scholarships and facilities for specially-abled students in examinations and hostel accommodation, fee exemption etc. The Cell provides regular updates to students about scholarship schemes available through the Social Welfare Department, Govt. of J&K and National scholarship schemes offered by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India. Special sports activities like Para-marathons are regularly organized in addition to Skill and Training programmes. The Cell also provides aids, appliances and assistive devices for specially-abled students which include wheelchairs, smart canes, digital hearing aids and smart devices for visually impaired students.

# Sports Activities

The University of Kashmir is deeply committed to promoting a vibrant sports culture on its campus, investing in both indoor and outdoor sports infrastructure. The University has a full-fledged Directorate of Physical Education and Sports which organizes a number of sports activities at regional, state and national levels throughout the year. The University has adequate facilities for sports and cultural activities. The Directorate of Physical Education & Sports of the University of Kashmir has been established with an avowed objective of promoting sports culture among the youth for overall development of their physique and personality.

Sports events being organized under the auspices of the Directorate at UT and national level go a long way in promoting cultural integration amongst the

people belonging to different geographical settings and socio-economic backgrounds besides helping sports tourism in Kashmir. On February 28, 2025 Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of the UT of J&K, Sh. Manoj Sinha inaugurated state-of-art synthetic athletic track surface in presence of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, University of Kashmir, Prof. Nilofer Khan. Directorate organized Inter-College Hockey, Cricket, Football, Volley Ball, Kho-Kho (Women's), Cycling, Judo, Kabaddi, Weightlifting, Powerlifting, Penchak Silat, Wushu, Badminton, Winter Sports, Water Sports, Para-Cricket and Table-tennis tournaments over the past two years. Two-day workshop on Yoga and Well-being and International Yoga Day celebrations were also organized by the Directorate. Besides these tournaments, the directorate also conducts inter-department competitions for the promotion of its own students in all the sports and games categories mentioned above.

Directorate of Physical Education and Sports also promotes sports for the society at large by establishing sport coaching academies in four disciplines of football, hockey and volleyball in which children under 17 years of age receive coaching from the qualified and trained coaches of the directorate. This year university bagged three medals in all India Inter-University games. Directorate also signed some MOUs with Sports Authority of India (SAI) for the establishment of Khelo India center and Center of Excellence in six disciplines at the University.

Seven pass-outs of the Directorate were appointed as Physical Education Directors by Jammu and Kashmir Public Service Commission (JKPSC) for various colleges of the UT of J&K during the year 2025.

## Fostering Excellence Through Sports

The University of Kashmir nurtures a vibrant sports culture through robust infrastructure, inclusive competitions, coaching academies, national-level events, and strategic partnerships, promoting youth development, cultural integration, sports tourism, and excellence, reflected in medals, new facilities, and successful professional placements.



# Mega Sports Events



The Directorate of Physical Education and Sports, University of Kashmir organized a four-day All India Inter-University Powerlifting Championship (April 4th to April 7th, 2025) in collaboration with the Association of Indian Universities. The event saw enthusiastic participation from 222 universities and more than 1200 powerlifting athletes and 400 coaches/managers from across the country. Union Minister of State for Youth Affairs and Sports, Government

of India, also visited the annual athletic meet of the university conducted after a decade and attended the medal ceremony, where she distributed medals among the podium finishers. This championship aimed to provide a competitive and spirited arena for university level power lifters, setting the stage for the upcoming World University Games later this year. The championship not only celebrated strength and stamina but also symbolized national unity through sports.



# Governance, Leadership and Management

**U**niversity of Kashmir envisions creating an intellectually stimulating environment, promoting excellence in teaching, research and extension activities and facilitating academic freedom, diversity and harmony. The University governance structure includes Board of Studies (BOS), Board of Research Studies (BORS), Finance Committee, Academic Council, Syndicate and the University Council, through which the academic and non-academic policy decisions are approved for implementation towards the attainment of the University's vision.

Under the leadership of Vice-Chancellor, the University functions through Registrar, Dean Academic Affairs, Dean Research, Controller of Examination, Dean College Development Council, Dean Students Welfare, Deans of Schools, Directors and Heads of Departments working with synergy and collectively for the realization of institutional goals. It places significant emphasis on academic autonomy and decentralized management, fostering a culture of participatory governance at all levels.

The University practices e-Governance in all the possible areas of administration, academics, examination and finance. The views and suggestions of the stakeholders are considered in planning and execution of university level

activities. This holistic approach to governance and management accentuates the university's commitment to continuous improvement and academic excellence as it navigates the dynamic landscape of higher education in the 21st century. The teaching faculty operates under regulations issued by the University Grants Commission and the Union Ministry of Higher Education.

Additionally, student feedback provides a holistic evaluation of teaching effectiveness, allowing students to voice their opinions on teaching methodologies and engagement levels. For non-teaching staff, performance appraisals are conducted through a transparent Annual Performance Report System, ensuring objective and consistent evaluations. The commitment to a supportive work environment is evident through the robust appraisal systems and comprehensive welfare measures, fostering a productive atmosphere where employees can thrive.

Through proactive financial management and strategic partnerships, it effectively manages financial resources, supports academic excellence, and positions itself as a leader in higher education and research. In this direction more than 60% of faculty have undergone various FDPs besides more than 70% of teachers have been financially supported to participate in seminars/conferences.

These initiatives underscore the University's commitment to innovation, growth, and global academic leadership within the region. It operates under a structured framework governed by financial regulations overseen by a Director of Finances appointed by the UT Government. This governance ensures meticulous management of the University's financial operations, essential for its smooth functioning and adherence to legal and regulatory standards. Regular internal and external financial audits are conducted.

Further, for promoting employees academic and administrative commitment, university operates several welfare schemes for the teaching and non-teaching staff. The full-fledged Directorate of Internal Quality Assurance (DIQA) ensures assurance and maintenance of quality in the university and organizes quality related workshops and seminars on regular basis besides presenting University before various ranking and grading agencies for accreditation and ranking.

# Infrastructure Development

**D**eveloping requisite infrastructure is crucial for any institution to flourish and is considered a hallmark of its overall progress and development. It is particularly required in contemporary times, when state-of-the-art infrastructure has become the need of the hour in light of the requirements for NAAC/NAB accreditation and assessments. Infrastructural development has been a thrust area for the University of Kashmir ever since its inception, be it at the Main campus of the University or the development of its Satellite Campuses at Zakura, Kupwara, Baramulla and Anantnag. The University has a statutory Building Committee which has members from both within and outside the University that supervises the approval and execution of infrastructural projects.

The Main campus is spread over 247 acres of land which has known for its beauty and green cover. Our University, over a period of time, has developed adequate and state-of-the-art physical infrastructure and other resources needed for quality teaching, learning, and research. The Main campus has separate buildings for Administration, Examination, Central Library, Distance Education,

Students Welfare Department, Directorate of Information Technology and Support Systems, Malviya Mission Teacher Training Centre, Hostels, Residential Quarters, Guest Houses, Public Relations Centre, Centre for Career-Counselling, Coaching and Placement, Convocation Complex, Physical Education and Sports, Directorate of Lifelong Learning and Skill Development, Health Centre, Bank, Post office, Shopping Complex, and many others, besides having a good number of academic blocks.

The infrastructure includes wifi-enabled campuses, 299 smart & IT-enabled classrooms, 186 well-equipped departmental laboratories, 35 conference rooms, 11 auditoriums, 2 museums, and a botanical garden. In the past five years, 12 laboratories have been renovated under RUSA to improve infrastructure and ambiance. The Central Library, known as Allama Iqbal Library, is one of the biggest libraries in India housing a total collection of more than 8 lakh books, e-books, journals, theses, dissertations, and manuscripts. The Central Library is fully automated using the integrated Library Management System “Virtua” and RFID technology. Besides Knimbus software is used to offer remote access to electronic resources. The other noteworthy facilities include the 24x7 Section, Rare Collection, Career Corner, Book Bank, and Visually Impaired Patrons Section.



A state-of-the-art gymnasium, yoga centre, athletic track, and sports hostel contribute greatly in the overall physical development of our students. Besides, an indoor stadium is under construction at the cost of Rs 22 crores.

Upgradation and expansion of the University remains a central area of our institutional development. In this regard, in the financial years 2023-2024 and 2024-2025, numerous infrastructural projects were completed. These include an IT Innovation Park at the Main campus, a four-storeyed Boys hostel at the Zakura campus, a five-storeyed Girls Hostel at the Main campus (Lal Ded Hostel), Health Centre at the South Campus and upgradation of the road network at the Main Campus. These enhancements will address the growing demands of infrastructural expansion and transform the university into a future-ready institution capable of serving as a leading centre of Higher Education in J&K.

# Design Your Degree: Lead Your Learning

**T**he Four Year Undergraduate Program (FYUGP) offered through Design Your Degree (DYD) mode at the University of Kashmir represents a decisive shift from conventional undergraduate education to a learner-driven, future-oriented academic model envisioned under NEP 2020. Rather than fitting students into rigid disciplinary boxes, DYD empowers them to design their own academic journeys, blending disciplines, skills and real-world engagement into a coherent, meaningful degree.

Over the last two academic years, DYD has demonstrated strong enrolment retention, zero dropouts in recent batches and a steadily expanding academic footprint. The programme is distinguished by its emphasis on experiential learning, where classrooms extend into communities, markets, heritage spaces, laboratories and innovation hubs. Students engage in field surveys, documentary production, design thinking bootcamps, technology workshops and community-based research, thereby translating theory into practice with confidence and clarity.

Students embark on small activity-based projects, which serves as a precursor to their main capstone projects. These capstone projects are carried out in groups on the field, under the close supervision of their respective mentors, allowing students to apply theoretical knowledge to real-world challenges. Some of the projects carried are on the theme like *Geo-spatial Mapping of Trees at Institute of Technology (IoT) Campus Zakura; Disease Detection and Pesticide Recommendation in Apple Crop of Kashmir; and Analysing Pedestrian Dynamics and Flow Patterns around Hazratbal Shrines; Hechun*

## DYD Redefining Undergraduate Learning



The FYUGP–Design Your Degree programme at the University of Kashmir embodies NEP 2020's vision by empowering students to craft interdisciplinary, experiential and socially engaged academic pathways that translate knowledge into real-world impact with zero dropouts and growing national recognition.

What sets DYD apart is its deep interdisciplinarity. Projects range from geospatial mapping, AI and robotics, environmental studies, and economics to media documentation, cultural heritage, and social innovation. Institutional collaborations with NIT Srinagar, Delhi University, SMVDU, IIT Bombay initiatives, and multiple





internal university centres have enriched student exposure and academic rigor. Robust mentoring by a diverse panel of senior faculty further anchors the programme's academic credibility.

Importantly, the DYD Centre has received consistent administrative and financial support from the University, including dedicated NEP funding, advanced laboratory access, smart classrooms, and digital learning platforms. These investments have translated into measurable outcomes—student achievements at national platforms, innovative project outputs and growing visibility in academic and public domains.

Significantly, during the recent NAAC assessment, DYD was explicitly mentioned among the notable departments and academic initiatives of the University, underscoring its relevance, innovation and institutional value.

Most recently, the DYD programme was inspected by a high-level team led by Prof. Dinesh Singh, Vice-Chairman, J&K Higher Education Council, who reviewed its academic design, implementation framework and future trajectory, marking another important milestone in DYD's evolving journey.

# Allama Iqbal Library: A Portal of Knowledge

The Allama Iqbal Library, also known as the Central Library, is the intellectual and knowledge hub of the University of Kashmir. It has the distinction of being the largest library in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, with 72 Departmental Libraries attached to different Departments, Research Centres, Directorates, Institutes, and Campuses of the University. With its vast infrastructure and rich collections, it plays a pivotal role in supporting teaching, learning, innovation, and research across disciplines.

The Library houses 25 Divisions situated in well-designed, centrally heated halls, including the First Floor Reading Area and the 24×7 Library Reading Hall which is equipped with a Variable Refrigerant Flow (VRF) system for climate control and high-speed Wi-Fi connectivity. In terms of collections, the Library's strength is both extensive and diverse. It holds more than 8 lakh accessioned books, 56,513 back volumes of print journals, and over 13,000 e-journals accessible through Government of India's "One Nation One Subscription" initiative. The Library subscribes to around 100 national and local newspapers and magazines, 2,494 e-books, and 16 scholarly databases, including internationally acclaimed resources such as Scopus, CMIE, India Stat, and LexisNexis.

The Library's heritage and special collections further enrich its academic character. These include 432 manuscripts, 7,204 rare books, 17,512 digitized and out-of-copyright works, and backfiles of local newspapers dating back to 1989. In keeping with the University's inclusive vision, the Library also provides Digital Talking Books and a substantial collection of Braille books for visually impaired students besides special computer systems and IT gadgets.

One of the distinguishing features of the Library is its robust "Remote Access Facility" (RAF), enabling seamless off-campus access to subscribed e-journals, e-books, databases, and other electronic resources. This facility ensures uninterrupted academic engagement beyond the physical boundaries of the campus. Technologically, the Library is equipped with modern information and communication infrastructure. It successfully implemented the

Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) system in 2008, making it one of the pioneering academic libraries in the region to adopt this technology. The RFID-enabled self-check systems empower users to independently issue and return books, as well as monitor their accounts and due dates. In addition, CCTV surveillance across all floors ensures safety and security of both resources and users.


The Allama Iqbal Library has been ISO Certified since 2009 and renewed its ISO certification on March 22, 2024, reaffirming its commitment to the highest standards of quality management in automation, accessibility, and information services.

## The Library offers a wide spectrum of academic and research-oriented services, including:





ATAL INNOVATION MISSION

Atal Tinkering Labs under AIM are fostering innovation among school students in Jammu & Kashmir, with the University of Kashmir designated as Nodal Agency through ATL Sarthi to strengthen mentorship, capacity building, and the regional innovation ecosystem.

**A**tal Tinkering Labs (ATLs), established under the Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), NITI Aayog, are playing a pivotal role in nurturing innovation and creativity among school students across India. With 127 ATLs established in Jammu & Kashmir, and new 500 Labs sanctioned under frontier region programme a strong support ecosystem is critical for scaling impact, fostering innovation-led mindsets, and enabling teachers and students to leverage these labs effectively. AIM has launched 'ATL Sarthi', where a Higher Educational Institute (HEI) is linked to mentor ATLs, district clusterwise, for capacity building, mentorship, and monitoring activities. The program aims to build stronger linkages between schools, higher education institutions, mentors, industry, and government, thereby strengthening the innovation pipeline.

In this context, AIM in collaboration with the University of Kashmir has launched ATL Sarthi for J&K on 25th September, 2025. This initiative positions the University of Kashmir as the Nodal Agency to anchor all ATL-related activities across the UT.



# Institutional Values and Best Practices

**U**niversity of Kashmir prioritizes institutional values and best practices across teaching, research, and public outreach. It promotes gender-friendly education with a higher female enrollment rate and offers courses focusing on gender equity and inclusivity. The university has a dedicated Centre for Women's Studies and Research, and undertakes initiatives like skill development courses and partnerships with national programs.

The university has adopted sustainable practices, including solar energy, energy-efficient LED appliances, and a scientific waste management system. It maintains a green campus with over 12,000 trees, a ban on single-use plastics, and promotes eco-friendly transportation. Regular environmental and energy audits are conducted, and infrastructure supports differently-abled students.

The university fosters an inclusive environment through reservations, diversity-focused curriculum, and community outreach programs. It celebrates national events and follows an Institutional Code of Conduct. Notable research facilities have been established, and interdisciplinarity is encouraged to address societal problems. Research outcomes are shared with stakeholders, and public outreach programs empower marginalized communities.

The university has made significant progress in fostering creativity and entrepreneurship, with the establishment of innovation and incubation centers leading to award of patents and publications. These efforts demonstrate the university's commitment to mainstreaming institutional values and best practices.

# Gender Empowerment: Working Towards Inclusion and Equality

The University has a dedicated Centre for Women's Studies, an effective Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) and other measures in place to ensure gender equity. In recognition of gender specific initiatives, the University has been awarded the Gender Advancement for Transforming Institutions (GATI) award in 2023.

The University recognizes the importance of gender-related issues and promotes inclusivity and gender sensitivity on campus. Curricula are regularly updated to include gender-based courses, raising awareness on various gender related aspects. Regular seminars, workshops, and events are organized to sensitize students, staff, and faculty about gender justice. The University has a full-fledged Centre for Women's Studies and Research that runs a Master's programme in Gender Studies, playing a pivotal role in disseminating gender and women's studies concepts through teaching, research, curriculum development, field and extension work, training, and continuing education. Departments in the School of Arts, Languages and Literatures, Law, Social Work, Home Science, Mass Media and Journalism, and Education also offer gender-centric courses.

In June 2023, the University of Kashmir received the 'GATI achievers' award from the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India, for its contributions to gender equity and the promotion of women in all spheres of sciences, especially STEM disciplines.

The University is deeply committed to promoting gender-friendly education, a commitment evident in numerous initiatives and policies. The University offers over 60 courses across various disciplines to promote gender equity among its stakeholders, ensuring diverse representation and fostering inclusivity. Supporting infrastructure includes four hostels for female students and scholars, providing 199 rooms with a capacity for 812 boarders. A women's special bus service aids female students commuting from home. Each department features a common room and separate washrooms for female scholars and students, ensuring privacy and a safe environment. The Central Library offers a 24/7 reading space, an electronic resource section, a common room, and a "Books on Call" facility for pregnant women. Additionally, the University Health Centre has three female doctors available 24/7 to ensure female students' well-being.

To maintain a safe and secure environment, the university has established a Women's Empowerment and Grievance Committee to prioritize and address issues concerning females. An Internal Complaints Committee handles workplace sexual harassment complaints. A female proctor on the proctorial team is dedicated to upholding gender sensitivity while maintaining campus law and order, fostering a safe and inclusive environment, and addressing gender-related concerns. The university also had the honour of hosting "Civil-20 Gender Equality and Disability Working Group" to bring civil society's perspectives into the G20 discussions.

# From Campus to Career: Centre for Career Counselling, Coaching and Placement

The University of Kashmir places emphasis on nurturing students' potential, enhancing their professional competence and provide training for employment and placement. To achieve these ends, the University has a Centre for Career Counselling, Coaching and Placement (CCCP) which has been active in providing training and preparing students for various competitive examinations in addition to organizing placement drives. Established in 2004, the Centre has emerged as a hub for career guidance, coaching and leadership, empowering youth for societal impact. The Centre guides students through counselling, exam coaching and placements, enabling professional readiness and growth.

## Collaborations and Training Programs

The Centre collaborates closely with prominent chambers of trade, commerce, and industry, including the Confederation of Indian Industries (CII), Specialized Medical Company (SMC), Saudi Arabia and the PHD Chamber of Commerce.

## Recent Placements

In the year 2024-25, the Centre attracted leading business houses from across the country for campus recruitment drives, including Vedanta Resources Pvt. Ltd., Indigo Airlines, Mega Job Fair by (Association of Muslim Professionals (AMP) and Hamdard Foundation), Kredence Globals, Australia Bharat Electronics Pvt. Ltd. (BEL), SKIE Coaching Classes Academy, Cyber X Info Systems Ltd., Kalgidhar Public School, Punjab, Mega Placement Drive for Female Staff Nurse for Saudi Arabia, Amrit Pharmacy, Stanza Living Ltd, Mega Placement Drive for Female Staff Nurse for Saudi Arabia in collaboration with the Specialized Medical Company, Saudi Arabia and others. These efforts resulted in the placement of over 1,900 students across various roles in different companies/organizations.

## Coaching Programmes

With 41 coaching programs conducted so far, the Centre has trained over 4,000 students, producing successful candidates in Civil Services, NEET, JEE, NET, and JRF examinations. In RCP-24, 87 students qualified the JKPSM Prelims, while 10 students cleared the UPSC Prelims. CCCP conducted three Mock Interview Sessions, 24 participants successfully qualified Assistant Director (E&S) exam out of 45 participants.

## Flagship Program: CRISP – 2025

CRISP is an intensive, fully residential coaching program aimed at preparing candidates for the UPSC Civil Services Examination (Prelims, Mains & Interview).

## Free Coaching and Career Counselling

The Centre provides free coaching to Civil Service aspirants and has trained 66 teachers from all Departments and Centres of the University as certified career counsellors. It also offers placement guidance and career counselling to students across Departments and Centres.

## Awareness Programmes

The Centre regularly conducts workshops, awareness sessions, and motivational programmes to familiarize students with exam patterns, preparation strategies, and emerging career opportunities.

# EMRC – Educational Multimedia Research Centre


**E**MRC, University of Kashmir, is one of the 22 EMRCs set up by the University Grants Commission (UGC) across the country under the umbrella of Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC). The Centre is involved in the production of educational content (e-content) for students. It provides an excellent opportunity for teachers to generate e-content in the form of ETV programmes, documentaries, multimedia and learning objects and helps students to benefit from vast educational resources available within and outside the UT of J&K. The Centre has been given additional responsibility to develop MOOCs (Massive Open Online courses) which are available on SWAYAM web portal (Study Web of Active Learning by Young and Aspiring Minds). SWAYAM is a MHRD e-learning initiative with the aim to reach to the wider audience/students. The SWAYAMPBABHA has been conceived by Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) as the project for using the (2) GSAT-15 transponders to run (32) DTH channels that would telecast high quality educational programmes on 24x7 basis. Under the Swayam Prabha, EMRC Srinagar has also been allotted one-DTH Channel entitled Life Science Channel. The Centre has been upgraded to High Definition with automation of its production workflow by establishing Central


# Showcasing Artisan Talent







# Human Resource Development: Empowering Educators

in order to create a community of potential leaders in various academic disciplines. The Centre has a long tradition of conducting regular Orientation, Refresher and other training programmes.










